**GEO 187/150: Guatemala Language and Culture**

- 2 weeks intensive language study while living with local families.
- 1 week exploring and learning about ancient Mayan civilization at Tikal and other Mayan archaeological sites.
- Study the impact of hurricanes, volcanoes, and earthquakes.
- Learn about Guatemalan culture through guest lectures.
- Study strategies for economic development, in particular the growing emphasis on tourism.
- Visit Antigua one of the oldest (est. 1543) and most well-preserved colonial cities in Central America.

**ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS**

This course is open to all undergraduate and graduate students who are working toward a degree at a U.S. university or college. No prior knowledge of Spanish is required. When necessary, an interpreter will accompany the class on excursions. Students majoring in geography, environmental studies, women's studies, history, anthropology, liberal studies, education, psychology, sociology, and international business would be interested in this course. All majors are welcome.
